

## Assignment 2a

Here are *some* of the things to accomplish prior to our next class, which will be October 13. Since we have two weeks between classes, there will be *more to follow*.

- ❑ Visit **home base**, <http://linc50.wordpress.com/>.
  - Be sure you have subscribed to it.
  - Read and comment on the post, “Adaptive Expertise.”
- ❑ *Building 21<sup>st</sup> Century Schools* Module Three, “Some Educational Possibilities”:
  - On the CD, go to Module Two, “Some Educational Possibilities,” and click on #1, Challenge.
  - Create a “new post” (not a page) in your blog, title it “Some Educational Possibilities: Initial Thoughts.” In the body of the post, write your initial thoughts in response to the question.
  - After you write and publish your initial thoughts, go back to Module Three and view the Resources (step 3 in the challenge cycle). Note that there are two pages to this set; don’t miss page 2, “Cyclical Environments.” The total running time of the resources for Module Three is 26 minutes.
  - Now, create a new post in your blog titled “Some Educational Possibilities: Revised Thinking.” Write and publish your revised thinking based on the resources you viewed.
- ❑ *Rethinking Education in the Age of Technology* (Collins & Halverson text)
  - Read Preface and Chapters 1 through 4 (pages 1–65).
  - Participate in the related discussion in Administrator 2.0 (see below). Plan to spend at least 20 minutes thinking and writing your own thoughts in response to the prompt you will find there as well as 10 minutes or so to comment upon what others have written.
- ❑ Administrator 2.0
  - Go to <http://admin20.learncentral.org/welcome>.
  - Watch the 2 minute introductory video.
  - If you are not already a member, register to be one.
  - Once you have completed the registration process, find the group with our name, Ed Tech for Administrators, and join it.
  - After you’ve joined the group, go to Discussions where you’ll find “Thinking About Rethinking.” Reply to the prompts in the comment area. (See illustration on next page.)
  - Here is a link to the discussion; however, it won’t work until you have joined our Ed Tech for Administrators group.

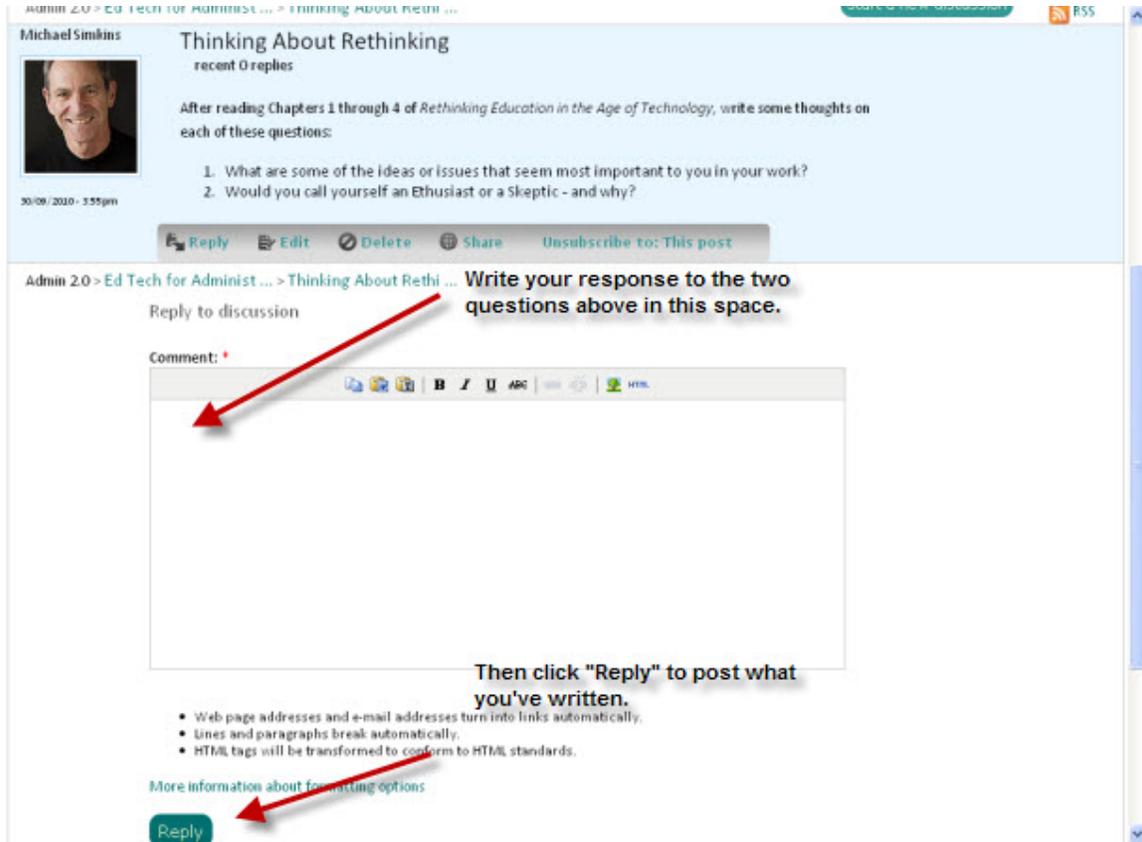

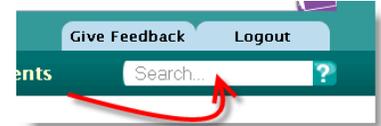
## Quick Start Guide — Administrator 2.0 on LearnCentral

Joining a new network can feel a bit overwhelming. Depending upon your interests and motivation, there are many directions to go in. Maybe you want to find and connect with colleagues from your area. Or, you may want to search for discussions relating to best practices on informing parents about cybersafety. You may be searching for some specific information or just want to browse the network, resources, groups, and events. This guide will help you get oriented quickly to share information, resources, and best practices with colleagues and make useful connections!

### Searching for colleagues, discussions, resources, groups, and events

The first thing you may want to do is search for specific people, discussion topics, resources, groups to join, or events. The search box in the top right searches all these areas.

- ⇒ Type a search term (i.e., name, keyword, etc.) in the search box.
- ⇒ Click on the  or press Enter/Return.
- ⇒ Click on the type of content you would like to see: **Resources**, **Blogs**, **Members**, **Discussions**, **Groups**, **Events**, or **Recordings** (the number of results from the search for each kind of content is in parentheses).



- This search is specific to the Admin 2.0 Private Community (except for groups and discussions).
- ⇒ Click on **LearnCentral** Community Tag for a wider search.
- ⇒ Click on the  next to the Community Tag to omit searching that community.
- ⇒ Unselect the **LearnCentral** Community and click on **Refine** in the **Group** and/or **Discussions** Tab to only search the **Admin 2.0** Community.
- ⇒ You must click **More filter options** if the community buttons are not shown.



### Connecting with Colleagues

- ⇒ Click on a colleague's name.
- ⇒ Click on **Connect** to add this person to your Network list



### Joining Groups

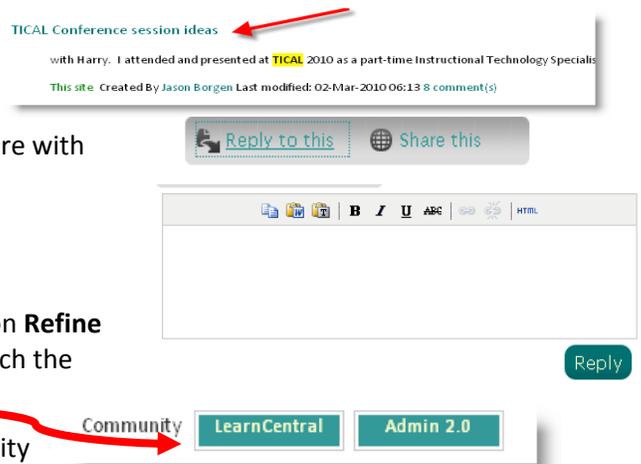
Groups are sub-communities within the larger Admin 2.0 and Learn Central network. Groups can have their own discussions, resources, events, etc. This is a great way to create and/or join an intimate online community with specific interests (i.e. principals on the west coast).

- ⇒ Click on a Group Name to view some basic information if it is a public group.
- ⇒ Click on **Join Group** from the group page or the list page.
- ⇒ Request membership to join groups that are private. These have a  icon in the lower right corner.
- ⇒ Unselect the **LearnCentral** Community and click on **Refine** on the **Group** and/or **Discussions** Tab to only search the Admin 2.0 Community.
- ⇒ You must click **More filter options** if the community buttons are not shown.



## Responding to Discussions

- ⇒ Click on a discussion.
- ⇒ Decide which post you want to respond to.
- ⇒ Click on **Reply to this** to reply or **Share this** to share with colleagues.
- ⇒ Type in your message with links and formatting.
- ⇒ Click on **Reply** to post message.
- ⇒ Unselect the **LearnCentral** Community and click on **Refine** on the Group and/or Discussions Tab to only search the Admin 2.0 Community.
- ⇒ You must click **More filter options** if the community buttons are not shown.



## Viewing and Accessing Resources

Resources can include documents, presentations, spreadsheets, videos, virtual meeting recordings, web links, and much more. Each resource is given a Creative Commons Share-Alike license, allowing for educational and/or personal use.

- ⇒ Click on the title of the resource to read more information about it.
- ⇒ Click on **Download Resource** to save it to your computer or **Copy Resource** to save it to your personal portfolio.
- ⇒ Click on **Your Comments or Rating** to comment and/or give it a thumbs-up vote.
- ⇒ Click on **LearnCentral** Community Tag for a wider search.
- ⇒ Click on the **X** next to the Community Tag to omit searching that community.



## Exploring the Community

The navigation at the top allows you to explore the entire community. The **Home** page will take you to the area of all the most recent activity. Learn more about the [Home page here](#). The **Resources, Network, Forums, Groups,** and **Events** Navigation all have a secondary menu that appears when you hover over it to
